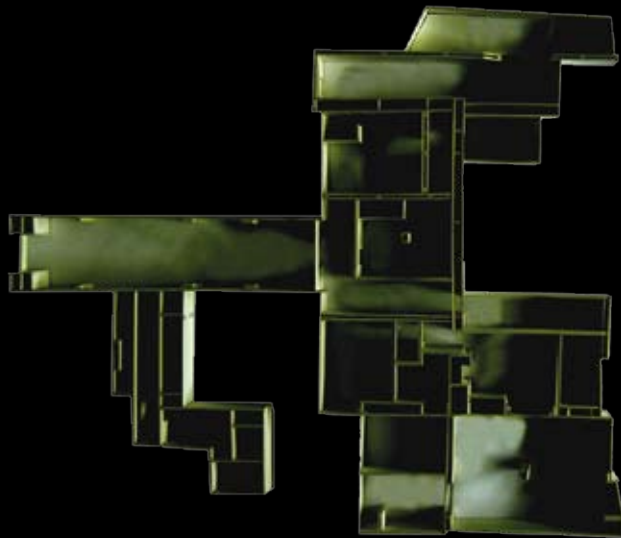

A group exhibition that brings together 13 visual and cross-disciplinary artists to produce a series of interventions and installations in the basement of Shoreditch Town Hall. **15th-17th May 2009**

17 Rooms is indicative of the way London artists have worked for generations. Brought together with the need to forge communities and share ideas, but still requiring to work in isolation in order to pursue the development of personal ideas. The exhibition is an extension of the day to day phenomenon of individuals seeking self expression in spite of the anonymity of urban life.

All the artists in this exhibition are from Westland Place Studios, a long established series of workspaces a stones throw away from Shoreditch Town Hall. In their working lives their studio environment provides the personal space in which to conceive and manifest their work. Geographically they work side by side, but creatively they are worlds apart.

Explore the 17 rooms within the evocative and labyrinthine like basement of Shoreditch Town Hall to view new and exciting work by 13 artists linked together by the need to show but separated by their passion for independent expression.

Work will include: drawing, film, installation, painting, photography, printmaking and sculpture.
